- _____ 1. If in the opinion of the official rodeo judge, a contestant is harassing the judge, rodeo secretary, rodeo contractor and personnel or MKYRA Board Member the contestant will be fined \$50 with option to be ejected.
- _____ 2. Contestant may be disqualified from a particular event or rodeo for not being ready to compete when called upon after the third and final call.

- _____ 8. Judges must remain available to the rodeo office until the rodeo secretary has made a final check of the rodeo books.
- _____ 9. Re-rides are given because of broken equipment furnished by the contestant.
- _____ 10. Senior boy bareback contestant is required to ride 8 seconds to receive a score.
- _____ 11. In Senior boy bareback no hot shot shall be used until the animal turns his head out of the chute.
- _____ 12. Bulls must be drawn and have horns tipped to the size of a half dollar.
- _____ 13. In Junior Boys Steer Riding the time starts when animal's inside front shoulder passes the plane of the chute.
- _____ 14. In Junior Boys Steer Riding knots or hitches are allowed to prevent rope from falling off the animal when riders leaves the steer.
- _____ 15. In mutton busting assisted riders will be allowed a maximum of 15 points.
- _____ 16. An electric eye timer and at least one manual back up watch will be used in barrel racing.
- _____ 17. If a contestant is disqualified for not following the pattern he/she may restart the pattern.
- _____ 18. Touching pole is permitted by horse or contestant.
- _____ 19. In pole bending must start to the right of the poles then run the remainder of the pattern accordingly.
- _____ 20. Breakaway string shall be #18 twisted mason line.
- _____ 21. The contestant will receive time should he/she break the rope away from the saddle horn by hand.
- _____ 22. In Breakaway a ten (10) second penalty will be added for breaking the barrier.
- _____ 23. In Breakaway the roping box will not be considered part of the rodeo arena.
- _____ 24. In calf roping the contestant shall have a neck rope or equivalent equipment adjusted in such a manner that will keep horse from dragging the calf.

- _____ 25. The horse must break the plane of the barrier box before the roper may rope.
- _____ 26. In team roping if the steer is roped by one horn, roper is allowed to ride up and put rope over other horn or head with his/her hand.
- _____ 27. The contestants may be disqualified for loping their horses around the arena when the steer is loaded and ready.
- _____ 28. Senior girls will have a 35 second time limit to get their goat tied.
- _____ 29. All goats with horns must have their horns tipped.
- _____ 30. In goat tail untying the goat will be tethered at a point 75 feet from start line.
- _____ 31. In goat tail untying the time runs from the time the start line flagger drops his/her flag starting the time until the judge drops his/her flag as the contestant crosses the finish line.
- _____ 32. In chute dogging with the gate open on the bucking chute to 90 degrees, at that point, a chalk line is parallel to bucking chutes five (5) feet beyond the end of the open chute gate.
- _____ 33. In chute dogging when the contestant calls for the stock and the animal falls (completely down) before crossing the score line a re-run may be given.
- _____ 34. In steer wrestling there is a 30 second time limit.
- _____ 35. In steer wrestling, steers must be drawn, be uniform in size and have their horns tipped.
- _____ 36. The contestant has the option to flank his calf in the calf riding.
- _____ 37. In barrels and poles once in the arena the contestant has 30 seconds to get her/his horse set and start the pattern by crossing the timer or receive a \$15 fine.
- _____ 38. Junior and Peewee's may be led into the arena directly in front of the chutes. Helper may hit the horse once it passes the plane of the arena gate.
